Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students

Choffin Career and Technical Center (CCTC) received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act, Pub.L. No. 116-136 (March 27, 2020 authorized from The Secretary of Education (“Secretary”) an allocated amount of \$186,502.00 to Choffin Career and Technical Center (“Recipient”).

Section 18004(c) of the CARES Act requires Recipient to use no less than fifty percent of the funds received to provide emergency financial aid grants to students for expenses under a student’s cost of attendance, such as food, housing, course materials, technology, health care, and child care. To students under Section 18004(c) of the CARES Act.

This is to address the pressing financial need of the students due to the disruption of campus operations.

Choffin Career Technical Center (CCTC) Adult Career Center has applied for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Student’s under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES)Act. As part of the application for emergency Financial Aid, the district acknowledged, signed and returned to the U.S. Department of Education a Certification and Agreement and assurance that the district will use, or intends to use, **no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES**

Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students, for the Spring of 2020 who completed the respective programs; **Practical Nursing, Surgical Technology and Dental Assisting.**

The total amount of funds received for the students at **Choffin Career and Technical Center (ADULT) for distribution for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to is \$93,251.00.**

The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants to be distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) is \$93,251.00 as of 8/13/2020

The estimated total number of students at Choffin Career and Technical Center (ADULT) eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section(a)(1) of the Cares Act is **53.**

As of 8/13/2020 a total of 53 students will receive an Emergency Financial Aid Grant under Section (a)(1) of the CARES ACT.

The amount of full-time adult student's that were eligible under section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 WAS 53. The district will disburse funds to the 53 students equally in an effort to assist them with costs incurred due to the disruption of campus, it was determined that due to the high percentage of Title IV students with ongoing needs, feedback from staff, instructors and students that all 53 students would be in need of additional assistance during the state of emergency.

To date up \$1759.45 per student in Cares Act funding will be distributed to eligible students.

Students must have met the following conditions.

Pell Grant and Title IV eligibility during Spring of 2020

Enrolled in certificate program

Completed program

Encountered pandemic –related expenses for housing, food, health-care, child-care, technology

Those qualified will receive up to \$1759.45
